**PUBLIC INPUT ON 2021-2022 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET IN
ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 484, PUBLIC
ACTS OF 1991**

Mayor Coleman opened public hearing for any comments or questions for 2021-2022 Fiscal Year Budget. John Brown, Soccer Representative had 3 questions: 1. Concession Stand at Soccer Field 2. Nets behind soccer fields 3. Lights at back of field. Aldermen and Mayor stated that they have considered the need for a concession stand at that area and would apply at the upcoming park grant to provide some type of concession stand. The nets behind the soccer fields belong to the city not school, and once the school is at their new location, the parks would be re-evaluated to best provide the services of the sports. Alderman Betts and Alderwoman Presson noted how important soccer is to our community. Alderman Painter noted he had asked for a coke machine to be placed at pavilion and the board shot it down.

- **CALL TO ORDER**
Mayor Coleman called the meeting to order and determined a quorum.
Present were Kevin Painter, Scottie Betts, Vanessa Presson, and Sam Gilley.
- **OPENING CEREMONIES**
 - A. Invocation was given by Sam Gilley.
 - B. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Scottie Betts.
 - C. Mayor Coleman welcomed everyone in attendance.
- **APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM REGULAR SCHEDULED MEETING
April 5, 2021**
Alderman Betts made motion to approve minutes of April 5, 2021. Alderwoman Presson seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-1. Sam Gilley abstained-absent at meeting.
- **APPROVAL OF AGENDA for May 3, 2021**
Alderwoman Presson made motion to approve agenda for May 3, 2021. Alderman Painter seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

- **REPORTS**

- A. Parks and Recreation / Public Works-

- Mike Hutcherson reported storm drain at Arbor Oaks is going to have to be repaired and Mary Kay drainage project is almost complete. The bridge at park is 99% complete and he is reviewing street condition on Blackmon St from Middle School Street to Bobbitt Road. It is estimated to cost \$135,000 to be fixed. He wants to watch the area and re-evaluate at a later date. Mike stated he was asked by Soccer Association if the back drop soccer nets were the school's. He stated no, they are the city's. Kevin Painter asked if rock could be put in place near the recycling bin next to Hornet Drive to make it easier to pull off road to unload cardboard. Mike noted that he would get that done.

- B. Fire Chief-

- Jeff Rollins reported 30 fire/first responder calls for the month of April, 19 city and 11 county, He reviewed monthly report and noted they have 1 new volunteer member and he has not heard from grant at this time. He also noted that EMS Med will no longer be running lift assist so first responders will have more calls to respond to relating to this assist.

- C. Police Chief-

- Jason Oliver reported 126 citations for 153 violations, 977 camera tickets, and 525 calls for service for the month of April. He reported that all 4 new Tahoes have been delivered. He was asked how long before they would be put on road and Chief stated approximately two weeks. He also noted the Crown Vics would be sold on Gov Deals as well as three seized vehicles. Alderman Betts thanked the police department for drug arrests made. Chief Oliver thanked the board for the purchase of the new Tahoes.

- D. Building Inspector-

- Matt Brown reported 4 building, 3 plumbing and 1 pool permit for the month of April. He issued 29 ordinance violations and 1 resident has been summoned to court on May 11 for yard debris, etc. It was noted by aldermen of the delay in mailouts by post office and advised to be cautious of time restraints set due to delayed mail.

- E. Recorder/Treasurer-

- Kim Gilley reminded everyone that fireworks would July 2. Audit letter of review was sent to Mayor and Aldermen for their review. Asked for the board's determination of the public works mower and parks and recreation truck that is in the amended budget, if they will allow these items to be ordered prior to second reading due to the time restraints of ordering these items. She reported that City of Medina is required to construct a Park Master Plan prior to submitting a future park grant application. She will be working on this as the weeks follow. Currently there has been 3 offers by same person for Old Elementary School. Parties are waiting to review all options before making a decision.

- **2nd READING OF AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MEDINA, TO ALLOW FOR APPROVAL OF USES SIMILAR TO PERMITTED USES AND USES PERMITTED ON APPEAL IN R-1, R-1A, AND R-2 DISTRICTS UPON APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS**

Alderman Betts made motion to approve 2nd reading of zoning ordinance allowing approval of use of similar use in R-1, R-2, R-1A. Alderwoman Presson seconded the motion. Motion pass 3-0, 1 abstain (Kevin Painter)

- **1ST READING OF AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MEDINA AMENDING FY 2020-2021 BUDGET**

Alderman Betts made motion to approve 1st reading of amending FY2020-2021 budget. Alderman Painter seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

- **1ST READING OF AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MEDINA ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET AND TAX RATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2021 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2022**

Alderman Painter made motion to approve 1st reading of 2021-2022 budget ordinance with tax rate. Alderwoman Presson seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

Alderman Painter made motion to approve the ordering of truck and mower included in amended budget not to exceed \$33,000.00. Alderman Betts seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.


